Emory University Hospital and Emory Crawford Long Hospital, the teaching sites for the residency programs, are among the nation's leading acute care teaching hospitals.

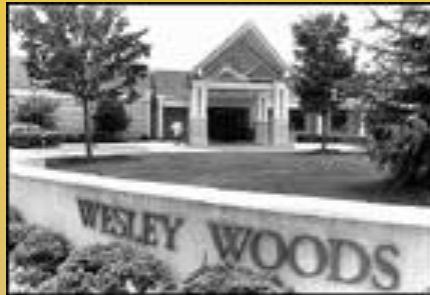

## PGY-1 Pharmacy Practice Residency

### Pharmacy Practice

(three positions)

The goal of the Emory Healthcare Residency Program is to provide the educational experience necessary so that the resident may:

- function effectively as the pharmacist on a healthcare team
- utilize practice management skills to promote rational and safe use of medications
- identify, prevent, and resolve medication-related problems for patients in a variety of health care settings
- master personal development skills for life-long learning and professional growth
- contribute to teaching and research

## PGY-2 Specialty Residencies

### Hematology/ Oncology

(one position)

The hematology/oncology resident works with specialists in medical oncology, leukemia/lymphoma, bone marrow transplantation, pediatric, and gynecologic oncology to provide clinical and educational services. The resident is involved in teaching and research programs. Clinical responsibilities include pharmacokinetic consults, drug information on the use of oncolytic agents and investigational drugs, protocol development and management, and monitoring of drug therapy. The hematology/oncology program is offered as a one year program to those who have completed a PGY-1 residency.

### Nutrition Support

(one position)

The nutrition support resident works with the multidisciplinary nutrition support team to provide specialized enteral and parenteral nutrition support for all patient populations. The resident is involved in an active research and teaching program. In addition, rotations from the PGY-1 program are available to support the individual resident's goals. The nutrition support program is available as a one year program for those who have completed a PGY-1 residency or as a two-year program for those without PGY-1 training.

## Pharmaceutical Services

With the support of pharmacy technicians and interns, pharmacists provide comprehensive services to ensure the safe and appropriate use of drugs by:

- Providing pharmaceutical care to hospital patients
- Advising medical staff on patient treatments and formulary selections
- Identifying, resolving, and preventing drug-related problems
- Compounding and dispensing drugs, IV doses, and special products
- Monitoring and documenting drug therapy outcomes
- Conducting clinical research on drugs and delivery systems and publish results in peer-reviewed journals
- Educating patients, staff, residents, students, physicians and other healthcare professionals

Emory Hospitals provide computerized, 24-hour, unit-dose drug distribution systems. Clinical pharmacy specialists provide expertise in medication management for critical care, drug information, hematology/oncology, infectious diseases, neonatology, neurology, nutrition support, internal medicine, and transplant services.
